Do you know what happened on November 8, 2016? Not only was our president elected, New Yorkers voted for their senators and congressmen. New York State re-elected Senator Charles “Chuck” Schumer. Senator Schumer is a democrat and has been in office since January 6, 1999. He has been a senator for 17 1/2 years. Our other senator, Kirsten Gillibrand, has been in office since January 27, 2009. She will be up for re-election in 2018. Something that Senator Gillibrand cares about is affordable health care . “Family medical leave is about meeting the needs of family and employees”, said Senator Gillibrand.

Of the twenty-seven representatives elected to Congress, eighteen of them are democrats and nine are republicans. Congressman Charles Rangel, who serves the Harlem neighborhood where several Gillen Brewer students live, has been a representative since 1971 (45 years!). He belongs to the Ways and Means Committee, which is responsible for writing our tax laws.


